



Georgia Work Ready Skills Gap Tools Request

Work Ready skills gap training software is available to high schools in participating Certified Work Ready Community counties to help students prepare for Work Ready assessments, improve performance on the graduation test, assist in improving graduation rates and provide students with a better understanding of the skills employers look for in a successful employee.

The Governor's Office of Workforce Development will award 40 Georgia high schools three-year access to WIN or KeyTrain software through a competitive applications process. For your school to apply, please complete the following steps:

1. The county in which your high school is located should be a Certified Work Ready Community in progress (CWRC), or be willing to apply for CWRC. If your county is not CWRC, the steps for application can be found here:

2. Plan to provide the Work Ready assessment to at least 50 percent of your senior class for the next three years
3. Prepare a written description of how you will use the gap training software, including how you will incorporate the training to ensure all interested students will have the opportunity to utilize the program
